**CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS**  
Summary of Proceedings  
City Council Meeting  
January 31, 1977

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills met in special session at City Hall on January 31, 1977. Mayor Deacon called the meeting to order at 8:00 P.M. Council Members present were: Amori, Dolan, Dudley, Lichtman, Oppenhausser, and Smith. Others present were: City Manager Majoros, City Clerk Cairns, and City Attorney Donohue.

In memory of Mr. Joseph T. Brennan, Farmington Hills City Attorney, the Mayor asked for a moment of silence and requested that the City Hall flag be flown at halfmast for the remainder of this week.

After Public Hearing, amendatory ordinance No. C62-34 to rezone from (L-1-1) light industrial use to (E-5) expressway service use, 4.656 acres located on the north side of Grand River Avenue just West of 146 unanimously introduced.

After Public Hearing, amendatory ordinance No. C62-74 to rezone from (L-1-1) light industrial use to (B-3) commercial business use, 12.29 acres bounded by Ten Mile Road, Grand River, Haggerty Road, and I-275 unanimously introduced.

After Public Hearing, amendatory ordinance No. C62-73 to rezone from (L-1-1) light industrial use to (B-3) Commercial business use, 1.08 acres located on Grand River Avenue just West of I-275 (Restwell motel, 39047 Grand River) unanimously introduced.

Meeting adjourned at 10:06 P.M.
