Beautician develops hair dye for kids

After years of seeing children with poorly dyed hair, Shila Morganroth, a hair colorist for a Farmington Hills salon, decided to do something about it

salon, decided to do something about it.

She devised her own method of applying commercially produced hair products that was gentle enough for a child's head.

"These children, they could have moticed their hair was dyed. And walked the universe and no one would have noticed their hair was dyed. And would expect a child to have dyed hair." she said, with a shrug.

"It brought them out of the closet, like skeletons." she said.

Her method of coloring hair, which she's dubbed Natural-All, can be used on men, women and children.

"It's important to select mild materials." she said. "It has us impact on the results I can get when I use my method." said Ms. Morganroth of Southried.

HER METHOD OF APPLYING hair coloring was recently introduced at the Crimpers, Farmington Hills. Existing hair coloring products can be applied in a method different from the manufacturer's to obtain natural looking shades, according to Ms. Morganroth.

"In some cases, my coloring will improve with the sun," she said.

Her method avoids drying out bair, and giving it a straw-like appearance.

She plans to put her technique on the market for professional use and has applied for a patent. Her inspiration for emarking on the project is the number of persons she

sees with ruined hair.

"You wouldn't believe the hair color I see. I see persons without crowns, who really need help. Then they expect me to work miracles." she said.

"People buy haircoloring in a store and they think it will come out as well as if a professional had done it. When they buy coloring in the store, their hair's being bleached by two untrained people, themselves and the sales clerk."

THE TEXTURE OF THE HAIR, eye color, and bone structure of the person should be studied first before deciding on a new shade, she explain-

Although she's sure her method will result in a nicer color, there are some heads that she refuses to touch. "It ry to be truthful with my customers. Sometimes, they don't have be scaip for hair coloring. Sometimes, with children, they don't really want it.

"I wouldn't color the hair of a
seven-year-old boy, whose father

"I told the father that I wouldn't do
the boy's hair. It was something that
he would get over. He wanted has hair
colored for the wrong reasons.

"Just by taking the boy into the
salon and trying to solve his problem,
the father helped his son by showing
concern." She said.

"The boy just hopped off the child
without a care. He really ddin't need
his hair colored."
