Series on prayer runs 5 Thursdays

The Farmington-Southfield Vicariate will begin a five part series called "Lord, Teach Us To Pray" which will run on Thursdays, beginning March 3. Programs will run from 8 p.m. - 10 p.m. in Mercy Center, 28600 Eleven Mile, in Farmington Hills.

A spokesman for the group said the series is for "Christians who want to know what genuine prayer is — how they can pray in a way that does not separate faith from life, but brings faith and hope into their daily lives, and brings all their life home to God."

On March 3, Sister Mary Finn, IHM, a delegate for Religious of the Archdiocese of Detroit and a noted retreat director, will begin the series with "Personal Prayer."

FATHER RICHARD FOURNIER, director of special services and continuing education for the clergy in the archdiocese continues on March 10 with "Praying Through Choiceless Events."

This session will explore how to integrate even the apparent negative aspects and events in daily living. Fr. Fournier will discuss how to pray in times of loss, death, and personal suffering, when life seems to be filled with unexpected or choiceless events.

On March 17, Father Edward Farrell from Sacred Heart Seminary, will

lead the session in "Prayers in Scripture."

His talk will explore the questions on how Jesus prayed; what response comes from those who hear the Word of the Lord; and how to use the models of Scriptural prayer.

On March 24, Father Gerald Shirill, a co-pastor of Our Lady of Loretto Parish in Bedford and director of the archdiocese Institute of Pastoral Liturgical Ministries, will talk on "Liturgical Prayer."

THE SERIES concludes on March 31 with Sister Trinit Schilling, IHM, Catechist Formation director of the Birmingham-Bloomfield-Troy Vicariate.

Her talk is called "Community Prayer," which she calls the call to holiness, a call to prepare for friendship with God.

Jean Feterl, of St. Fabian Roman Catholic Church in Farmington, said of the series, "It is the springtime of the church, a time of renewal, revival and growth in our relationship with the Lord. What better way than by positive action, more experiencing the Lord in prayer, than in the company of fellow parishioners."

At each session, representatives of Alba House, in Dearborn, will display and sell books on prayer and the spiritual life.
