Baseball season set by Farmington league

Get those baseball mitts and spikes dusted off because South Farmington Baseball League is conducting registration, beginning March 5.

Participation in the 1977 program is open to boys of league age seven-16 and girls, eight-17. League age is the age of the player as of July 31, 1977.

Participants must live within the boundaries of Eleven Mile, Inkster, Eight Mile and Haggerty roads.

All registrations will be in the Farmington High School, 32000 Shuawassee. Registrants can apply between 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. March 5, and from 7-10 p.m. March 9. Final registration will be from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. March 12.

Parents or guardians must accompany the player to registration and birth certificates will be required for boys and girls who are participating for the first time.

Registration fees start at \$30 for boys and \$17 for girls.

All players, except 7-8-year-olds, must try out. Failure to attend any of the scheduled tryouts, unless excused

by a league official, is cause for a player to be eliminated from further consideration.

Players must show up even in the case of inclement weather since tryouts will be rescheduled that day. Pitching machines will be made available.

Players will be assigned to teams with the intent to make all teams in a given league as nearly evenly matched in ability as possible. Players' assignments will be conducted by managers under the supervision of the players' agent and league officials.

Player evaluation sheets from last season will be used in addition. Managers will draw lots for teams.

Late registrations can be accepted only on the basis of available team openings as determined by league vice-presidents, and a late charge of \$5 will be levied against each player who is a late registrant.

Registration refunds will be made available to players for whom no team assignment is made.

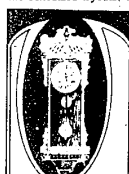
UM names honorees
