

### Senate studies women's bill

A bill that would give Michigan counties authority to establish and fi-nance women's commissions was in-troduced Feb. 15 in the by State Sen. John R. Otterbacher (D-Grand Rapids). According to Otterbacher, the pro-

Rapids:
According to Otterbacher, the proposal would broaden the current law that originally established the Michigan Women's Commission.
"My bill, which I am introducing on the birthday of a noted and respected femilists, Susan B. Anthony, would enable county governments to establish comparable commissions. This would give more women an opportunity to get involved in their own communities with Issues directly concerning toem."

Women's Commission is responsible to study and review the status of women in the state, discourage dis-crimination and to publicize the contri-butions made by women.

"A number of areas ranging from education opportunities to adequate health care are of special concern to women. However, an organized effort is needed at the state and local level if solutions are to be found. I believe that creation of local wymen's commissions, given adequate financial support, can be a significant and positive force in dealing with the problem. Graced by all women.
