Credit managers of several major chain department stores say the Equal Credit Opportunity Act, slated to go into effect next month, won't raise prices and or after past policies, but will credit more paper work. One store executive interviewed said his only fear was that the regulations might make creditors over-cautious in their lending policies. He said that some companies might refuse to extend credit to more persons with borderfine credit ratings to reduce the chances of being charged with discrimination. Under the act, everyone applying for credit March 23 or after, will be equally eligible, regardless of color, age (19 and up) or whether pand by an employer or by welfare. The new regulations ban discrimination on the basis of marital status color, race, sex, religion or age Present regulations only bar credit discrimination on the basis of sex or marital status.

Consumers also will be given the right to know why a credit application is rejected or is withdrawn or offered on terms much different from those sought by the customer. The regulations dictate that a credit-or can't just issue a general statement that the applicant didn't meet loan requirements.
