

Bridge

Freem distribution in today's deal created a variety of results in the master's pairs at the regional tournament in Cincinnati last weekend.

Several pairs holding the East-West cards played three notrump taking at least ten tricks.

One lucky South player played five hearts doubled and West led the king of clubs. This lead presented declarer with the contract. He ruffed the club in the closed hand, and lost only the two red aces.

West led the king of clubs.

West should have realized after his partner had overcalled one notrump promising at least fifteen points and a balanced hand that it was very likely that one of his opponents would be void in clubs.

One East player decided to pass (the trapping variety) North's opening bid and West bid four clubs. East raised to game and North doubled. North-South cashed two spades and West claimed the balance.

This type of hand is fun for the pair on the winning side and misery for the losing side.
