OU studies innovations to improve curricula

Oakland University has begun a selective study of teaching innovations at institutions throughout the country to stimulate improvement of its curricula.

The educational development program was announced by Frederick W. O'Beir, academic vice-president and dean, and the OU teaching and learning committee.

Three disciplines, chemistry, political science and the library faculty, have received the first development awards of \$1,000 each. Awards are given on a competitive basis, allowing faculty teams to travel to any university or agencies that have unusual programs that may be adapted for use at OU.

The visits and a written recommendation on the findings must be submitted to the university for possible action by fall, 1977. Another round of development travel awards will be made for the 1977-78 year. O'Beir said the educational development program is designed to keep the university strong.

Paintman trial to continue

The trial of Norman Paintman is expected to continue this week in Ingham County Circuit Court in Mason.

Paintman, 35, of Detroit, is charged with four counts of first degree murder stemming from the shooting deaths of four people in a Southfield apartment last February.

William W. Kidd, 26, of Detroit, was found guilty last week in Oakland Circuit Court on four counts of second degree murder for his role in the killings. He will be sentenced March 31 by Oakland Circuit Court Judge William J. Beer.

Beer is presiding over Paintman's trial in Mason where it was moved after Paintman's attorney requested a change of venue. The trial began last Thursday and is expected to continue at least through this week, court officials said.

Awards Program slated for youth

He is actively involved with youth and has written and directed youth programs presented at reform regional conventions. Recently, he has been a guest speaker on Michigan university campuses.

Chairman of the youth awards program is Mrs. Victor S. Horvitz of Birmingham, a vice president of the league.

Serving on the youth awards committee are: Mrs. David Levine of Southfield; Mrs. Stuart Megdall of Lathrup Village and Mrs. Harold Rosen of Birmingham.

Mrs. Leo D. Ordian of Southfield, a 1977 recipient of the Heart of Gold award, is president of the league.

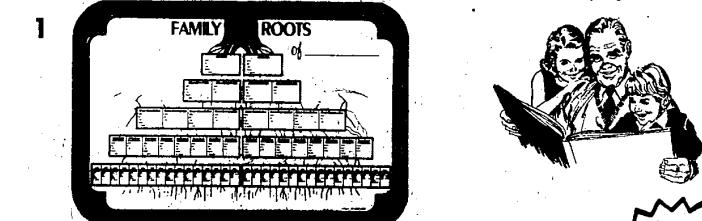

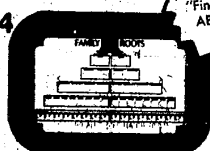
