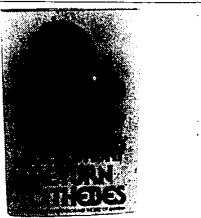

## Student gets top honor

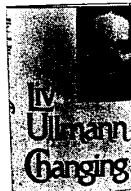

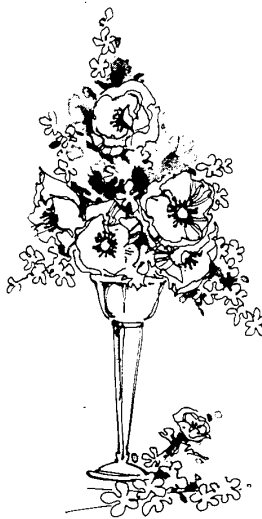
