

PGA-PBA outing set for summer

If you've ever wondered what it would be like to bowl or play golf with a professional, you're fantasy can be realized on July 12.

On that date the second annual Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Professional Golfers Association (PGA) Invitational Tournament will take place in Rochester. The unique combined competition—believed to be the only one of its kind in the United States—is also open to 192 amateurs who will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis.

"What this combined tourney does, is give the amateur the thrill of playing golf or bowling with a professional, as a team member," explained Bill Srook, whose North Hill Lanes will be the site of the bowling competition. "Not only does it provide the privilege of competing with a pro, but, in essence, it is a free golf and bowling lesson for the participants."

The event, which is jointly sponsored by Srook Brewery and John Maxwell of Bonanza restaurants, is the brainchild of Srook and fellow Rochester businessman Jim Dewing, head professional at Great Oaks Country Club.

"At first we joked about the idea," said Srook. "But, then I thought how great it would be if we could have a combined event such as this."

"It took us eight months by the time we got the sponsorship, and then we had only two months to put it together last year," he said. "Our hopes are to be as successful as we were last year. It exceeded all our expectations."

THE TOURNAMENT ACTUALLY combines professional bowlers and golfers with amateurs from both sports. There will be a collective purse of \$17,500—\$7,500 for the bowlers, and \$5,000 apiece for the golfers and amateurs.

Sixty-four PGA section golfers will

be joined in the tournament by 64 PBA bowlers and the 192 amateurs. They will be placed into teams of five and will compete in both bowling and golf.

Golfing (18 holes) will be scored on a five-man scramble basis as a team. In three games of bowling team scoring will be five-man total pins.

The 64 pro bowlers will participate in a qualifying round on July 11 at 7 p.m. with the top 10 competing for the PBA championship on July 13 at 10 a.m. Sandwiched in between will be the pro-am play at North Hills and Great Oaks.

The morning session will have 160 golfers teeing off shotgun style at 8 a.m., and 160 bowlers contesting at 9:30 a.m. The contestants will then reverse their fields in the afternoon session which begins at 2:30 p.m. The people who bowled in the morning, for example, will golf in the afternoon.

Lunch will be served at Great Oaks beginning at 11 a.m., and the awards banquet will also take place at Great

Oaks at 8 p.m. that evening. The PBA-PGA Invitational Tournament is one of a number of events that Srook has instituted since he settled at North Hill a year-and-a-half ago. Over those 18 months the enterprising pro has also started the Leader Dog Tournament and Michigan Majors annual tourney.

Also, for the first time in Rochester history, a sanctioned professional bowling tournament will be held later this summer. More than 80 ladies professionals will compete in a national weekend tournament at North Hills.

"I feel that these type of tournaments are a way of furthering the recognition of Rochester," said Srook. "They are a way of attracting people into the community... people that otherwise would never come here."

"I feel that I owe that to the community because they have supported us (North Hills)," he said. "And, the people in Rochester can continue to look for these kinds of events."
