## Child abuse seminar set

An all-day child abuse seminar, sponsored by the Michigan Institute of Law Enforcement, is scheduled for 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., March 31, at the Mercy Conference Center, 28600 Eleven Mile in Farmington Hills.

Michigan State Police and Odyssey Institute, a national organization which deals with child abuse and neglect, will participate in the seminar.

A representative of Odyssey's Detroit chapter will address the seminar attendees on their discovery of children being subjects of pornography, as well as on their programs of child abuse.

The second phase of the seminar will consist of an open exchange and discussion by Sgt. Darrell Pope, a 21 year veteran of the Michigan State Police assigned to the Sex Motivated Crimes Bureau in Lansing for the past 10 years.

Sgt. Pope's discussion will center on ways for police personnel, educators and social workers to encourage parents and community to report and follow up on child abuse cases.

Functions of the Sex Bureau as related to various outside agencies will also be discussed.

## CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was held Monday, March 21, 1977 at 7:30 P.M.

A Presentation "An Affordable Alternative," a Tri-County Public Transportation Plan developed by the Oakland and Wayne County Road Commissions was made. A Public Hearing was held to review proposed use of Revenue Sharing Funds for the 1977-78 budget year.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved. Minutes of Other Boards were received. Mr. John Cotton, 33318 Oakland, addressed the Council on behalf of citizens in the Historical District Area regarding the recent increases in property assessments. Permission was granted to:

Mrs. Leonard A. Tadrzynski, 22842 Beacon Drive, to erect a six foot fence at the rear of her property.

Edward J. Strye to use a large van and penants during their annual tire sale April 1-18, 1977 at the Strye Service Station, 32410 Grand River. St. Gerald's Church, 21300 Farmington Road, to conduct a Carnival-Fair on church property during the Memorial Day Weekend; the required licensing was waived for the charitable event.

Proclamation issued designating April 17-23, 1977 as "PRIVATE PROPERTY WEEK" in the City of Farmington. Resignation of Mrs. Doris Brucker from the Farmington Beautification Committee was accepted.

Council ratified a three year contract with the Public Safety Officers and with the Public Safety Sergeants and Lieutenants.

Council recommended approval to transfer Class C Liquor License from Danah Inn, Inc., 32005 Grand River, to Phil's Inc. Council authorized an increase in the cost for fingerprinting from \$2.00 to \$12.00 for all applicants.

A RE-PRINTING AND PARTIAL RECODIFICATION OF THE Farmington City Code was authorized. A meeting was scheduled for 7:30 P.M., April 4, 1977 to review proposed changes to the City Code.

City Manager was authorized to contact the Farmington Board of Education to obtain parcel of property needed to complete improvements to the Shiawassee/Farmington Road intersection.

The following resolutions were adopted:

Adding a "Public Comment" segment to the Council Meeting Agendas. Authorizing payment of \$56,371.00 for the Public Safety Facility Project. Authorizing Budget Adjustments to the 1977-78 fiscal year budget.

Authorizing the issuance of \$80,000.00 Special Assessment and \$22,000.00 General Obligation Bonds for SAD No. 76-67 Maple Street Paving.

The following three year term appointments were made to the Farmington Historical Commission:

Mrs. Margaret Walker, 33342 Shiawassee Street. Mr. William T. Ingalls, 33435 Alta Loma Street.

Farmington Area Recreation Commission Directors Reports were received. Council authorized the establishment of a 7-Member Ad Hoc Committee to review the City's Recreational Program needs.

The monthly bills were approved. The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 P.M.

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF FARMINGTON PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT, OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a special election will be held in Farmington Public School District, County of Oakland, for State of Michigan, on Tuesday the 5th day of April, 1977, for the purpose of submitting the following proposition:

In order to renew the four mill operating tax increase which expired in 1976, shall the limitation on the total amount of general ad valorem taxes which may be imposed for all purposes in any one year upon real and tangible personal property in Farmington Public School District, County of Michigan, be increased as provided in Section 6, Article IX, of the Constitution of Michigan, for a period of ten (10) years from 1977 to 1986, both inclusive, by four (4) mills on each dollar (\$4.00 per \$1,000) of assessed valuation of property as finally equalized, for the purpose of defraying a part of the operation expense of the school district?

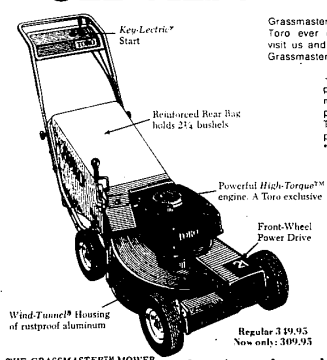
