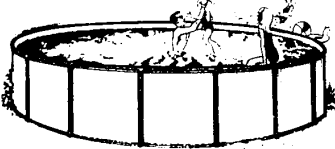

## Romney Vetoes Bill To Ease Liquor Code

LANSING -- Gov. George Romney has vetoed a bill which would have permitted the State Liquor Control Commission to license package liquor, beer and wine takeout stores within 500 feet of a church or school.

Proponents of this measure argue that the 500-foot rule was not intended to apply to takeout stores, and that the (liquor control) commission should be given the latitude called for in this bill, Romney said in his veto message.

"There should be a specific and firm dividing line, and I do not believe that a division of 500 feet between these frequently conflicting purposes is too much to ask. I see no sound purpose to be served in permitting this type of exemption to the 500-foot rule."

TOLEDO -- The City Council unanimously approved a handgun ordinance Monday that will halt the flood of unregistered pistols from Toledo to metropolitan Detroit.

The ordinance orders:

All Toledo residents who now own guns to obtain proper registration identification cards from the police within 90 days;

All Toledo gun dealers and pawnshop owners to purchase licenses within 30 days or discontinue sale of guns;

All individuals (including Michigan residents) who wish to purchase guns in the city to fill out an application form and wait for police to determine if the applicant has a criminal record.

The police chief and safety director have the power under the ordinance to refuse an application.

This ordinance covers the City of Toledo only, its suburbs and surrounding cities have no like safeguards.

PARIS -- Nguyen Thanh Le, spokesman for the North Vietnamese delegation to the Paris peace talks with the United States, has blasted both the Republican and Democratic Parties, but saved a special attack for the GOP presidential candidate Richard Nixon.

Le said that the Republican platform and Nixon's personal stand could not possibly lead to an end to the Vietnam War.

He asserted that he did not want to interfere in the internal affairs of the United States, but thought it was pertinent to give his views on Republican statements concerning Vietnam. He added that he was referring only to their stand on Vietnam.

WASHINGTON -- Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey, expressing confidence he'll win the Democratic presidential nomination on the first convention ballot, has pegged his delegate strength at 600 votes.

Meanwhile Georgia Gov. Lester Maddox says he may turn the Democratic race into a four-way battle to show Americans the party "offers more than liberals and socialists."

The Democratic nomination in Chicago in two weeks will require 1,312 votes.

Humphrey said, "Let me tell you I feel rather relaxed, I feel good. I think we ought to be looking forward to November."

Maddox said his candidacy would offer the party its only conservative contender.

GROSSE POINTE -- John S. Pingel, a 1939 graduate of Michigan State University who served on the Board of Trustees in 1964, has announced he will seek the Republican nomination for one of the two trustee posts to be elected in the fall.

He said he is trying for the nomination because he loves MSU and wants "to help in the formation of some policies that I think are forward looking."

IONIA -- Three straight days of sunshine drew big crowds to the Ionia Free Fair last weekend, making up for admission losses in the grandstand and midway incurred earlier last week due to rainy weather.

The fair set a record with over 920,000 paid admissions for the rides on the midway. The Saturday night grandstand attendance also set a record with 5,760 paid. Total for the 10 days was 34,520 compared to last year's 22,358.

LANSING -- The Michigan State Police reported that 1,270 persons had lost their lives on Michigan highways so far this year compared to 1,127 deaths for the same period last year.

Twenty persons were killed over last weekend, they said.

Without traffic fatalities were up nearly 90 per cent this year over the same period last year and the number of tickets written for moving violations was down almost 45 per cent.

LANSING -- Michigan Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley has ruled that counties which operate a water system may not lay pipelines under or through city streets without permission.

Kelley wrote the opinion to Wayne County Prosecutor William L. Cahalan, who said that Wayne County had installed pipelines within city streets there. Cahalan said that Detroit wanted to use its streets to lay large water mains to connect parts of county owned and operated water systems.

Although Kelley said that counties must first get permission from cities before laying water pipes, he added that "the city may not withhold such consent arbitrarily and unreasonably."

DURANGO, Colo. -- A tragedy, that will not be forgotten by the patrons of a tavern in Durango, struck when Gene Gutierrez, 39, who had dressed as the legendary Mexican outlaw Pancho Villa for the Durango rodeo, fired his .38-caliber pistol loaded with blanks and killed a 19-year-old girl.

When the man entered the tavern the girl, Claudia Garcia, jokingly asked him to shoot her and, all in fun, he shot the gun in her direction. The girl fell to the floor bleeding.

She was rushed to a local hospital where she died later of a wound inflicted by a blank cartridge that was smaller than the gun barrel. Police said the undersized blank was fired through the gun when the trigger was pulled.

TOKYO -- Japan is taking a serious look toward the Soviet Union both for markets and for raw materials.

The reason is twofold. Most important, trade with Peking continues to decline. Also, the Soviet Union is an important source of lumber and logs which is becoming increasingly attractive as the United States restricts exports of logs from the Pacific Northwest.
