IRS offers tax help

Taxpayers can elect to have the Internal Revenue Service compute their income tax on either the short form (1040A), or long form (1040) if they have an adjusted gross income of \$20,000 or less.

Persons filing form 1040 must also take the standard deduction to qualify for the computation. IRS spokesmen said.

To take advantage of IRS tax help the taxpayer need only complete certain portions of his or her tax return attached all W-2 forms, sign the return and mail it by April 15 to the address listed in the tax instruction booklet.

Detroit garage sale depends on volunteers

Hundreds of volunteers, mostly from the suburbs, have devoted months of effort to Detroit's spring garage sale, being billed now as "The World's Largest Garage Sale," to be held in Cobo Hall April 13-14.

Farmington Hills resident Marilyn Wohlman is one of the volunteers, now winding up acquisitions for auction merchandise, enlisting entertainment and celebrity hosts.

She and her counterparts, representing almost every Detroit suburban community, were responsible for raising \$92,000 last spring from the sale of antiques, memorabilia, and sometimes just plain junk.

They work in cooperation with city employees, businesses throughout the metropolitan area, and a host of entertainers, also volunteer, under the

direction of garage sale coordinator Patti Knox.

Entertainers lined up so far to furnish music and laughter to the 77 sale are the Belgian-American Accordian Band, The Pow Wow, the Hellenic Society Performers, the Detroit Recreation Puppets, the Maureen McGovern Irish Step Dancers, the Opus IV Band, the Polish Women's Alliance Orchestra and Dancers, the Phoenix Rock Group and Sawdust the Clown.

ON SALE will be parking meters, a bait box, a "Please Don't Feed The Animals" sign from the zoo, stainless steel bedpans and park benches, to name a few of the items.

Money raised from the '76 sale was used to purchase uniforms for the Civilian Police Reserves.
