## musical set for April 1-3

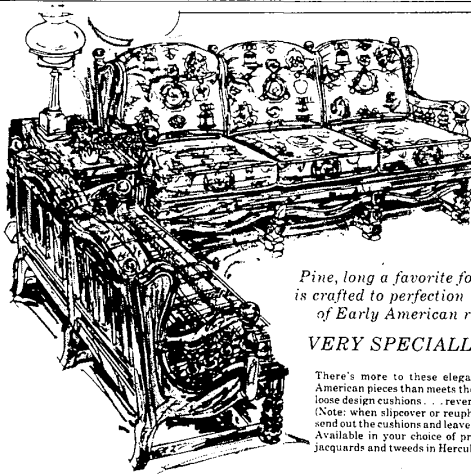
