Pianist Louis Nagel, Ph.D., will perform an all-Brahms recital at Schoolcraft College as a special benefit for the Michigan Music Teachers Association (MMTA) collegiate scholarship fund.

He will be heard at 8 p.m. Monday, April 25, in the Waterman Campus Center of the college, 18600 Haggerty, Livonia.

Nagel will perform the Sonata in F minor, Piano Pieces Op. 117 and "Variations on a Theme by Handel."

Suggested donations are \$5 for general admission and \$1.50 for students.

The recital will be on the eve of the annual spring convention of MMTA. The one-day meeting at Schoolcraft will draw private and college teachers from around the state to hear student winners of MMTA competitions from grade school through college. Jean Cundlish of Livonia is program coordinator.
