FARMINGTON — Although they won't be aware of it, four service men in Vietnam this Christmas will receive Red Cross "Dirty Bags" provided by the hard work of four Farmington lads who appreciate the fact that they themselves will be home for Christmas.

Twelve and 13 years old, the local boys raised the \$2.75 cost of their gift by their own hard work, doing odd jobs or through their Easter prize & Observer paper routes, not from their parents.

The boys -- Mark Garcia of 32263 Craftsbury, Jeffrey Roberts of 33337 Grandview, Tag Girolant of 32302 Craftsbury and Michael Roehrig of 32299

Craftsbury -- heard that Michael's mother, Mrs. Arthur Roehrig, was collecting funds to purchase dirty bags and decided to do their part.

Mrs. Roehrig made one stipulation -- they must earn the money themselves.

Each earned \$2.75 and the money was turned over to Mrs. Joan Bodnar who has delivered it to the American Red Cross.

## Third Time

FARMINGTON — Army Sgt. Kenneth A. Stearns, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. Allen W. Stearns of 32701 13 Mile, Farmington, is in good condition after being wounded for the third time in Vietnam.

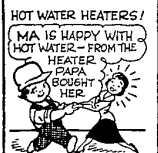
Sergeant Stearns is in Valley Forge Army Hospital in Pennsylvania. His lung, abdomen, diaphragm and left leg were injured by a land mine explosion while on patrol near Chu Lai on Aug. 5. Fifty-seven pieces of shrapnel were removed from his body.

Three Bronze Stars, three Purple Hearts, two Medals for Valor and the Air Medal for combat assault have been awarded to Stearns since he arrived in Vietnam in December 1968.

His three Purple Hearts were awarded in March, July and August. All were awarded after he was injured by land mines or booby traps.

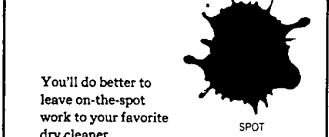
## Up Center
