Wilson Changes Sentences.

Washington.—President Wilson committed to 10 years imprisonment, the death sentence imposed upon Private Ernest Crutcheff, 36th infantry, who killed Sergeant Frederick F. Carroll, same organization, at LaVoivre, France, last August. The testimony showed that the prisoner had been threatened by the sergeant just before the killing. The death sentence passed upon Private George Davis, who killed Private Charles Jackson last August, was commuted to 20 years.

Faith in Britain.

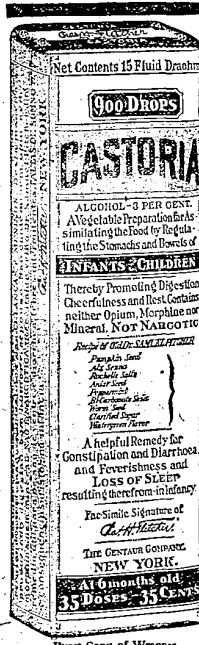
Through the darkest days of war the inhabitants of Little have held hope that their turn would come to be delivered from the invader by the British army.
