

# Water Bonds Approved

Said bids for the purchase of the above bonds will be received by the undersigned at 24021 Coward Road, in the Village of Quakertown, Michigan (post office: Farmington, Michigan 48034), until 8 p.m., Eastern Standard Time, on Monday, the 22nd day of September, 1969, at which time and place said bids will be publicly opened and read.

Said bonds will be coupon bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, maturing consecutive in direct order of maturity from 1 to 48, both inclusive, will be dated October 1, 1969, and will mature serially without option of prior redemption as follows:

- \$4,000 August 1, 1970.
- \$6,000 August 1, 1971.
- \$12,000 August 1st of each of the years 1972 and 1973.
- \$6,000 August 1, 1974.
- \$12,000 August 1, 1975.
- \$6,000 August 1, 1976.
- \$12,000 August 1, 1977.
- \$6,000 August 1, 1978.

Said bonds will bear interest from their date at a rate or rates not exceeding five and 9/100th per cent (5.909%) per annum, expressed in multiples of 1/8 or 1/20 of 1%, or any combination thereof. Said interest will be payable on August 1, 1970, and semi-annually thereafter on February 1st and August 1st of each year. The interest rate on any one bond shall be at one rate only and shall be represented by only one coupon for each coupon period and all bonds maturing in the same year shall carry the same interest rate. None of said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum which is less than 90% of the rate borne by any other bonds of this issue. Both principal and interest will be payable at a bank or trust company qualified to act as paying agent under Michigan or Federal laws and shall be designated by the general purchaser of the bonds. The designation of the paying agent shall be subject to the approval of the Village. Accrued interest on date of delivery of such bonds shall be paid by the purchaser at the time of delivery.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest on each bid will be computed by determining, at the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from October 1, 1969 to their maturity, and deducting therefrom the sum of the interest cost to the Village. The bid offering the lowest net interest cost to the Village will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation is the lowest net interest cost to the Village. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the issue herein offered or at a price less than 99.5% of their par value, will be considered.

Said bonds are issued in anticipation of the collection of a like amount of deferred installments of special assessments on Special Assessment Roll No. 2 of the Village for the purpose of paying a part of the cost of street improvements in said special assessment district, and in addition to the special assessments, will create the full faith and credit of the Village for their payment.

A certified or cashier's check in the amount of \$500, drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable to the order of the Village of Quakertown, must accompany each bid as a guaranty of good faith on the part of the bidder; to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest will be allowed on the good faith checks and checks of unincorporated holders will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Miller, Canfield, Padgett and Stone, attorneys at Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds, which opinion will be furnished without expense to the purchaser of the bonds prior to the delivery thereof and will be printed on each bond. There will also be furnished the usual closing documents, dated as of the date of delivery of and payment for the bonds, including a statement that there is no litigation pending or, to the knowledge of the signers thereof, threatened, affecting the validity of the bonds. The Village shall furnish bonds ready for execution at its expense. Bonds will be delivered without expense to the purchaser at Detroit, Michigan.

The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.

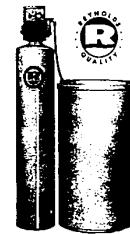
