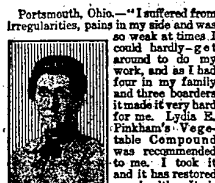

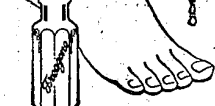

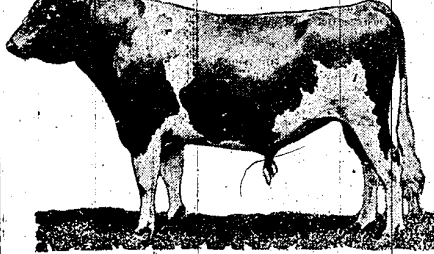


A Well-Bred Cow—The Dam.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.) In all bull-association work the influence of heredity is recognized. Since life tends to beget like in production as well as in appearance, there is little danger that the pure-bred bull whose ancestors for several generations have been first-class individuals will inherit or transmit the qualities of some inferior distant ancestor. If he is also well-bred, strong and healthy, he will almost certainly increase out of all proportion to his cost the income from the first generation of a scrub or low-grade herd. In fact the time may come when it will be possible to eliminate all bulls except those whose dams are in the advanced registry. If the best bulls were used to their full capacity in pure-bred herds, and if only good pure-bred bulls were used in the ordinary dairy herds, the income from the dairy business could be vastly increased. MORE RYE BEING PRODUCED

Greatest Increase Seen in 1917 and 1918—Farmers Becoming More Familiar With Crop. (Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.) More acres and more bushels of rye were harvested in 1918 than in any previous year in the history of the United States. From 1849 to 1909 rye production in the United States was practically stationary. From 1909 to 1918, the production was almost tripled, the greatest increase coming in 1917 and 1918. Five years ago there was approximately 1 acre of rye for each 21 acres of wheat in the United States; in 1918 there was approximately 1 acre of rye for each 10 acres of wheat. The 1918 rye crop was more than 70,000,000 bushels. The world production of rye amounts to about one and two-thirds billion bushels, somewhat less than half the annual wheat production. The United States department of agriculture thinks it probable, now that farmers are becoming familiar with the crop and its advantages, that rye will have a permanently larger place in American agriculture, and that from an agricultural point of view there should be a further considerable increase in production.

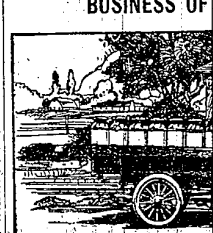
What, then, of the future? We hear much talk these days of the approach of a so-called saturation period—a time when so many cars will have been built that sharp curtailment of output must come.

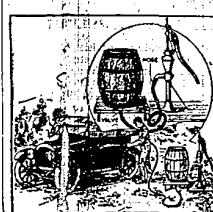

DIFFICULTY IN WASHING CAR

Operation Can Be Performed by Man Working Alone If Barrel is Piped on Platform.

The great difficulty in washing automobiles, there no water under pressure is available, is to operate the sprayer put up, and at the same time use a sponge effectively, says Popular Mechanics Magazine. A large water and air-tight barrel with both heads bolted, is inserted in one of these heads. The barrel is then placed, with the faucet down, upon some sort of platform. A hose is attached to this faucet, and to the nozzle of the force pump. After the valve is opened, water should be pumped into the barrel, until it is about three-fourths full. valve is then closed, and the hose is removed from the nozzle of the force pump. To use the barrel as a force sprayer, it is only necessary to put a nozzle on the hose and open the valve at the top of the barrel. The air, which is compressed by pumping the water into the barrel, forces the water out when the valve is opened, thus making an effective spray. All these operations can be performed by a man working alone.

TAR REMOVED FROM MACHINE

Almost Impossible to Run Over New Roads or Pavements Without Getting Some on Car.

It is hardly possible to drive a machine over newly tarred roads or pavements without getting at least some of the tar on the body, if treated in time the spots are not difficult to remove. The most reliable method is to wash the machine with kerosene, and carefully dried with charcoal, so that the tar will not smear. A little vaseline applied over each spot and worked in with the fingers will help to remove the stains. A thorough wash with body soap and a final polish in the usual manner completes the operation. When going down a long hill change from one brake to the other so as to allow the lining to work. If this is not done brake linings wear away rapidly and sometimes burn. Thus, by frequent changes you prolong the life of the lining several hundred per cent.
