Tuesday, Sept. 23, 200 "The
Indian Braves" will be in-
vading Farmington schools with
the blessing of Dr. Roderick
J. Smith, superintendent of
schools. In recognition of the
work done by the local YMCA
Indian Guide Program, these
boys will be wearing their award
vests and head bands to school
that day.

"The Indian Guides were
founded 25 years ago and the
program is based on a firm
foundation in Farmington with
more than 30 tribes involving
over 500 fathers and sons.

"That's what it's all about,
Fathers and sons (ages 6-12)
having fun together in local
tribes.

No boy can become a
"tribe brave" unless his dad
becomes a "big brave." This
is the only rigid rule of the
program.

Local tribe meetings are held
twice each month in the homes
of members and are limited
to 60 minutes with time for
light refreshments. Fathers and
sons participate in all phases of
the ritual and program.

Just what work and play is
done in any tribe is left for the
tribe to decide. Activities in-
cluded such things as handi-
craft, inspection trips, story
telling, team games, hikes,
camping and the study of In-
dian lore and relics.

The Farmington Federation has
overnight camping in October,
January and June, a pop-
corn sale in November and
family pancake supper in May.

An opportunity to learn more
about the program and to or-
ganize new tribes will be avail-
able at a meeting to be held at
7 p.m., Sept. 25 in Dunkel Jr.
High, 32800 West 12 Mile.
All Farmington fathers with
boys in first, second and third
grades are urged to attend.

Notice is hereby given that in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law", the undersigned Clerk, will open any day, except Sunday and a legal holiday, the day of any regular or special election or primary election, except for registration the names of any legal voter in said Township, City or Village not already registered who may APPLY TO BE PERSONALLY for such registration.

The Fifth Friday preceding said Election

As provided by Section 498, Act No. 116, Public Acts of 1954 As Amended.

From 8 o'clock a.m. until 8 o'clock p.m. on said day for the purpose of REVIEWING the REGISTRATION and REGISTERING each of the qualified electors in said TOWNSHIP, CITY or VILLAGE as SHOWN on the REGISTRATION book.

In addition the Clerk's Office will be open from 8 o'clock a.m. until 5 o'clock p.m. on the Saturday preceding the Fifth Friday.

The names of no person but an ACTUAL RESIDENT of the precinct at the time of registration, and entitled under the Constitution, if remaining such resident, to vote at the next election, shall be entered in the registration book.

ELECTOR UNABLE TO MAKE PERSONAL APPLICATION, PROCEDURE

SEC. 504. Any elector who is unable to make personal application for registration because of physical disability or absence from the Township, City or Village in which his legal residence is located, may be registered prior to the close of registration before any election or primary election by application to the Clerk of the Township, City or Village in which is located his legal residence, duplicate registration cards and executing in duplicate the registration affidavit before a notary public or other legally qualified to administer oaths and entering such registration cards in the book of the Township, City or Village before the close of office hours on the last day of registration prior to any election or primary election. The notary public or other duly qualified administrator shall sign his name on the line for the signature of the registration officer and duplicate his file.

UNREGISTERED PERSONS NOT ENTITLED TO VOTE

SEC. 491. The inspection of election of any election or primary election in this State, or in any District, County, Township, City or Village thereof, shall not receive the vote of any person whose name is not registered in the registration book of the Township, Ward or Precinct in which he claims to vote. (As provided under Act 116, P. A. 1924.)

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION, APPLICATION, TIME

SEC. 506. Any registered elector may upon change of residence within the Township, City or Village cause his registration to be transferred to his new address by sending to the Clerk a signed request, stating his present address, the date he moved there, and the address from which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer. The Clerk shall strike through the last address, word and printed number and record the new address, word and printed number on the original card and duplicate registration cards, and shall place the original registration card in proper precinct file. Such transfer shall not be made after the Fifth Friday next preceding any regular or special election or primary election (unless such Fifth Friday shall fall on a legal holiday in which event registration transfer shall be accepted during the following day).

TRANSFER OF REGISTRATION ON ELECTION DAY

SEC. 507. Any registered elector who has removed from one election precinct of a Township, City or Village to another election precinct of the same Township, City or Village and has not received such removal with the last election shall execute a transfer of registration request, listing the new residence address (upon his signature), with the election board in the precinct in which he was last registered, or by applying in person for a transfer. The inspection of change of the registration records shall compare the signature with the signature upon the applicant's registration record and, if the signatures correspond, then the inspection shall certify such fact by affixing his initials upon said record. The application for transfer, after having signed an application to vote as provided in Section 503 of this act, shall be permitted to vote in such precinct for the primary or election itself. The application for transfer shall be filed with the Township, City or Village Clerk who shall transfer such voter's registration in accordance with the application. When the names of any elector in a Township, City or Village have been changed, it shall be the duty of the Township, City or Village Clerk to make the change to show the proper name of elector in the registration records, and it shall not be necessary for the elector to change his registration with respect thereto in order to be eligible to vote.
