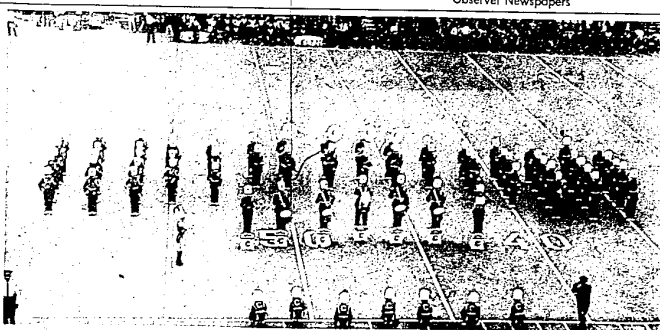

Pursell Interested In Transit Post

Wayne County Supervisor Carl D. Pursell (R-District 20), representing Livonia, Plymouth, Northville and Canton, has declared his interest in a seat on the nine-member Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA).

Pursell was recommended by the transportation and economic development committee of the Board of Supervisors. Appointments to the transportation authority are made by the governor from nominations submitted by the legislative bodies of the six counties encompassed by the authority, by the mayor of Detroit, and by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

Three members are up for reappointment -- Bernard Lundquist of Detroit, John Flanagan of St. Clair Shores, and Marshall Campbell of Port Huron. Campbell has indicated he does not wish to be reappointed.

Pursell said: "I consider the SEMTA organization to be the last, but not the best, hope of implementing a much-needed vital transportation system in this region and will serve, if nominated by the governor, to the best of my ability."

SEMTA was established by state law in 1967, with the authority to plan, develop and operate a regional surface pub-

lic transportation system which would include rapid transit and buses.

Livonian's Art Shown At Scarab
