MRS. CARLOS STEELE DIED

Sunday Morning, July 4th at Her Home in This Village.

Funeral services were held at the family residence at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, July 7th for Mrs. Carlos Steele, who passed away Sunday morning, July 4th. Rev. C. H. Patterson, of the church of Our Father, Detroit, officiated.

Ellis Nelson, daughter of August Nelson and Joseph Adair, was born in Orion, Oakland county, Michigan, September 18, 1840. The family later moved to Detroit where she was a pupil at the historic old Capitol school, at that time the most advanced public school of the city. Subsequently the family moved to Shiloh, Shiawassee county, where she was married October 18, 1866, by Rev. C. W. Knicker, to Carlos Steele of Farmington, who brought her to the old homestead where she resided until December 25, 1903, the family came to this place.

She was the mother of nine children, the eldest of whom died in infancy. She is survived by eight daughters, nineteen grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, all of whom are residents of this locality. She was a devoted wife, a good friend and a hospitable hostess and member of the Universalist church. Her death was a great loss to all who knew her so well.
