Grounds around the school include a baseball diamond, three softball diamonds, a playfield and playground equipment.

Since about 1970, the school district has been losing about 500 students a year. This year's school population for grades kindergarten through 12, is down more than 1,000 students, school officials report. The decline is expected to continue through 1980.

A recent task force, however, urged that no additional schools be closed in Southfield. Instead, task force mem-bers say, efforts should be made to reduce class sizes and expand uses of school space. The school board has not acted on the recommendations yet.
