

District seeks bids on Angling Road Elementary

If you're looking for a 17-room estate situated on 16 acres close to the expressway, Southfield Public Schools has the place for you.

Last week, the board of education unanimously voted to seek a new tenant for the former Angling Road Elementary School. The school, located on Franklin Road south of North-western, is currently leased by Detroit Bible College.

In August, however, the small religious college is moving to facilities in Farmington Hills.

Rent for the school building amounts to about \$2,680 a month or more than \$6,400 over the course of the two-year lease. The college also pays utility costs and other expenses.

Lease bids will be received until 4 p.m. April 14. Offers will be reviewed by associate superintendent Ronald Rohman and presented to the school board May 23.

The one-story elementary school was closed by the school district in the spring of 1976 because of declining enrollment throughout the district.

THREE OTHER schools were also closed. Lederle and Birney elementary schools, were annexed by middle schools that adjoin those buildings. Lathrup Elementary School was turned into a pre-school center.
