# Detroit Mackenzie '5' tops N. Farmington

If Detroit Mackenzie's Keith Smith happened to set a state scoring record in a basketball game, the fans would probably leave the gym raving about his superb passing instead of his point production.

NORTH PULLED to within five points (61-56) at the end of the third quarter, but the game's outcome was never really in doubt.

North's big front line—Harold Beardsley (6-7), Mark Riehl (6-7) and Jeff Thomas (6-5)—was not to be intimidated when the inside play got rough. Despite getting into foul trouble early, Beardsley and Biehl combined for 33 points, and Thomas added 14 points and grabbed 11 rebounds.

North's physical style of play impressed Mackenzie coach Elbert Richmond.
