Crucial calls are free in coin phones

Coin free emergency calls are available from most pay telephones in the state, according to Robert Hunter, spokesman for Michigan Bell.

About \$11 million was spent in the last 15 months to convert all but about 500 of the 48,000 pay phones in the state, according to Kenneth B. Lange, Michigan Bell vice-president of customer services.

Under the timetable worked out with

the Michigan Public Service Commission, the company was committed to have all pay phones converted by the end of 1977 except those in areas where new electronic switching equipment is to be in service this year, Lange said.

By October, callers will be able to get emergency assistance without first depositing coins.

Converted coin phones are clearly marked with dial instruction cards.

Poet Max Ellison will visit seven Farmington area schools this spring, at the invitation of Farmington Area Arts Commission, as part of its "Exposure to the Arts" series.

The 53-year-old Michigan native is the only American poet who was invited to the International Poetry Festival, at the University of Massachusetts. He has been dubbed "The Magic Minstrel."

It has been said of Ellison that he makes one laugh and think at the same time.

He will spend one school day in Longacre and Highmeadow Elementary Schools; in Warner, Power, Dunkel and East Junior High Schools; and in Farmington High School.

His time will be spent talking in assemblies, reading from his own works, and then chatting informally.

Most of the poet's life has been spent in farming in rural Michigan. He has published four books, can recite poetry

six hours from memory, and is now visiting colleges, universities and schools throughout the country.
