Coin free emergency calls are available from most pay telephones in the state, according to Robert Hunter, spokesman for Michigan Bell.

About \$11 million was spent in the state is months to convert all but about \$30 of the 48,000 pay phones in the state, according to Kenneth B. Lange, Michigan Bell vice-president of customer services.


