## Community schools add new classes for spring

Registration is now under way for all classes offered in the spring through Farmington Schools Community Education Department, with new offerings in both day and evening sessions.

Students may register by stopping into the Ten Mile Community School, 22789 Ten Mile, or calling the school, 474-5223.

Most of the classes will be given in Ten Mile School, where babysitting services are available for daytime students.

"Cooking Naturally," "Understanding and Helping the Aging Person" and "Beginning Popular Piano" are all new to the day time listings.

"Cooking Naturally" is led by Ruth Leib who will demonstrate ways and ideas to cook using natural foods. She believes that cooking naturally means cooking nutritionally and economically.

Guest speakers will lead students to understand and help the aging person with topics such as medical, social services, adjustment to widowhood, housing alternatives and choosing a nursing home. Emphasis will be placed on learning about physical and psychological changes that occur in later years.

Piano sessions will be limited to ten persons per class.

The daytime line up also includes a repeat of all workshops that were well received by students last term.

NEW EVENING classes are fishing techniques, beginning popular piano, stained glass art and Russian for beginners, all in Ten Mile School.

Golf lessons get started in Farmington High School, then move out of doors onto a driving range. Monday and Wednesday gym classes will be held in Farmington Training Center.

"Rent-a-Garden" is a something new where students will prepare a 20 by 30 foot plot to be ready for planting after May 1.

Persons interested in Rent-a-Garden are asked to make arrangements by calling the Community Education Office, at 477-1300, ext. 26.

In-person registrations are taken at Ten Mile School from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. weekdays and from 7 to 9 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Registration continues until all classes are filled.

The spring term begins the week of April 10.
