"Women have adjusted better because they have so many other things that they like to do—like crafts," he says. "Men need more leisure activities." Through his discussions and lee tures, Northey found people were greatly concerned about two factors of retirement. Their greatest concern was the effect of inflation on their futures, as retirees usually have to cope on fixed incornes.

A CONCERN THAT often materialized during his commanications was the loss of prestige when workers (especially men) leave their jobs. Northey says retirement its a great "evener."

Northey stresses that prestige is an artificial creation and therefore nothing to become auxious about.

Northey finds the best way to enjoy retirement is through service to others. He says people who have spent their lives accumulating more to support a family and buy a home should now travel, enjoy life and volunteer their time to others.

desire for seeking new experiences and interests. Thomas Northey, a former research consultant for the Michigan Education Association (MEA), was commissioned by the MEA to write "Easing into Retirement," a self-help manual for those approaching the "golden years."

Not surprisingly, Northey, 69, rec-mmends taking the second view of

Not surprisingly, Nortiesy, 66, recommends taking the second view of retirement.

"One purpose for writing the book is to help people plan for retirement so that they can enjoy it." Northey says.
"Pensions and social security are made for minimal living. So I try to get people to plan ahead."

In his book, Northey cites a 1973 study by a psychiatrist at the University of Washington School of Medicine. It states retirement is the most stress-producing event in one's life. Approaching retirement even topped prepancy, death of a close friend, or a child leaving home in terms of stress produced.

Northey says people today are encouraged to retire earlier than in the past because of today's economic climate and inflation.


CITING THE GOVERNOR'S last state of the state address, Northey says government encourages early retirement. Gov. William Milliken proposed a task force to investigate pre-retirement planning. Northey says he didn't experience any problems prior to his retirement because he planned for it. He suggests health care should be of primary concern when approaching retirement. People should then examine their financial sibation and plan activities for their free time. "The hardest person to discipline is yourself—and how to handle free time," he says. Northey suggests people research how successful retrees have cope-with retirement, develop hobbies and find things to do that interest them. Men have more problems than women in planning leisure activities during retirement because they were overly disciplined in their work.
