"If the act is altered, as I think it will be, it is possible the district could operate during the 1978-79 year without going to the people for a millage increase," he added.

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A preliminary budget for the 1978-79 school year indicates that under the 1978-79 state aid formula as written, the district's expenditures will exceed revenue by 255,000.

The projected deficit takes into account a reduction of eight teachers forced by the estimated loss of 231 students in the distriction.

"I have no way of knowing when the state legislature will decide on the final state aid act, so it is difficult for ne to advise you (the board) on the best procedure. It was agreed by the board to wait until July before making a decision.
"If we get state aid, we might make it," McDowell added.

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
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
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
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
