House won't vote on canal treaty

Sponsors said they would bring the bill back under normal procedures requiring a simple majority for passog. Rep. Patricia Schroeder (D-Colo.), a supporter, said the bill imposes long-overdue limits on White House staff size. "In essence, it puts upon the President about the same criteria as we ourselves have for our own congressional staffs," she said.

Rep. Henry Hyde (R-III.) an opponent, asked: "Where are the Democrat demunciations against this bid which would give President Carber the most expensive White House in his tory—the same President Carber who, shortly after his inauguration, declared he was cutting the White House staff by one-third?" Members voting "yea" favored passage of the bill.

Reps. David Bonior (D-Mt. Clemens), William Ford (D-Taylor), and James Blanchard (D-Pl. Ridge), voted "yea."

Sponsors of the amendment contended that Article IV, Section 3, Clause 2 of the Constitution requires thouse as well as Senate approval of U.S. disposal of its property.


