

# OU beats Wayne in double header

Oakland University's baseball team rebounded from a disappointing doubleheader loss to Eastern Michigan University last week by whipping Wayne State University over the weekend, 2-1 and 6-1.

Tim Seagraves opened the 1978 Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) for the Pioneers by going the full seven innings and holding Wayne to just four hits. The Birmingham Brother Rice graduate struck out seven and walked one enroute to the victory.

Oakland, which had three hits in the opener, scored in the third and sixth without the benefit of a hit. Jim Dieters scored first.

Dieters was hit by a Jim Bohard pitch in the third, moved to second on Dave Robinson's ground out, and scampered to third when Jay Lentz was safe on an error. After Brian Cunningham went down on strikes, Dieters scored on a wild pitch as the Pioneers were attempting a suicide squeeze bunt.

Following the Tartars' single tally in the bottom of the third, the Pioneers scored the game winner in the sixth.

Oakland filled the bases when Bielski walked, Dieters took first after being hit by a pitch, and Robinson walked. With Lentz in the batter's box ready for another squeeze attempt, the

Wayne hurler threw another wild pitch and Bielski easily crossed the plate.

Even though OU could muster just three runs in the opener, it took advantage of Tartar mistakes—four walks, two hit batsmen and an error—to win.

**THE WET AND** cold conditions which restricted offensive output in the opener, subsided a bit in the nightcap.

Birmingham Seaborn grad Jim Kazanski won the second game, fanning five Tartars and allowing only one walk in seven innings as OU jumped on Wayne early.

In the first infielder Henry Washington got on by error, and Dennis Krych walked before Bielski popped out. Four more walks, to Dieters, Robinson, Lentz and Ed Vojush, staked OU to a quick 3-0 lead.

The Pioneers, benefactors of 12 walks and two hit batsmen in the second game, scored two times in the third. Dieters was hit by a pitch, and raced to third on Robinson's double.

After a walk to Lentz, Vojush cracked a single for two runs batted in. Vojush, from Sterling Heights Henry Ford, tallied another RBI in the seventh when, after Cunningham was hit by a pitch and stole second, he singled.

Wayne State's only run came in the

fifth when Doug Fowler doubled, and scored on Ken Hasshaw's single.

OU, 10-9 overall this spring and 2-0 in the GLIAC, travels to the University of Detroit this afternoon and Ferris State Saturday for doubleheaders. Hillsdale invades the Rochester campus for a twinbill on April 18, beginning at 1:30 p.m.

**OAKLAND'S TENNIS** team, which finished 15-14 in 1977, has jumped out to an 11-1 mark this spring under second-year coach Lee Fredericks.

Last week, OU dropped its only match of the season, losing to Wayne State, 6-3.

"It was a tough loss," said Fredericks, who is an assistant coach for the men's basketball team. He also noted that Wayne is the team to beat in the conference.

The Pioneers opened their GLIAC season against Ferris State late last month, winning 7-2. Over the weekend Oakland downed Northwestern Illinois, 8-1; Augustana Elmhurst, 7-2; and the University of Illinois at Chicago, 5-4.

OU gets back into league action today, hosting Hillsdale at 3 p.m. Some of the Pioneers who'll be out to improve their record are Terry Frost (10-2 at No. 1 singles) and Al Krapp (12-0 at No. 2 singles).

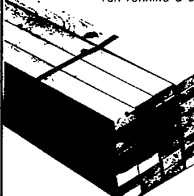

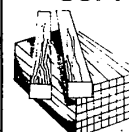
