'Focus on the Future' set for those over 55

"Focus on the Future," a program once limited to nuns, has been opened to women over the age of 55.

"The age limit," explained Jean Peter, program coordinator for Mercy Center, "was set because of the purpose and philosophy of the program."

Sponsored by Sisters of Mercy, its

purpose is to provide learning and enriching experiences with an informal format, free of the demands of assignments or tests.

The entire program runs from July 2-28, and winds up with a retreat. It offers classes ranging from sewing and dining through psychology and prayer. It aims to help participants prepare for, or more fully participate

in, meaningful occupations and avocations.

Participants are free to pick and choose the courses of their choice, with extracurricular activities, special events and field trips offered.

Participants also have the option of traveling to the center, or living there for the month. Room and board is \$92 per week. Tuition prices run from \$12 up. The most costly of classes is \$75 for driver's education.

SOME OF THE offerings listed in the brochure are "Aspects of Maturity," "Biblical Themes," several

kinds of dance lessons, guitar lessons, and hair care.

Others are "How to Tutor," macramé, pottery, swimming and swimastics, "Metri-Mage," "Prayer With Visuals," and "Ministering to the Sick, Aging and Dying."

Deadline for registration is June 1. Registrations for the retreat are to be made separately.
