



LJW youth awards slated for April 30

The League of Jewish Women's Organizations of Greater Detroit will continue a tradition begun in 1945 by honoring outstanding young people in the community.

At 2 p.m., April 30, at Congregation Shaarey Zedek in Southfield, Jewish youth will be cited for outstanding scholastic and religious achievement and for civic participation.

The affiliate organizations of the league have been asked to nominate Jewish high school seniors who excel scholastically, demonstrate leadership ability, participate in community or service organizations and have formal religious or secular Jewish education. Guest speaker at this year's event will be Rabbi Irwin Groner of Shaarey Zedek. This year, there will be 39 honorees, who with their families and sponsoring organizations, will be recognized.

Each candidate was asked to submit an application listing his or her activities and experiences. Each was required to submit a one page essay on this year's assigned topic, "To me Judaism is..."

In addition, each candidate was personally interviewed by a panel of judges comprised of David Hermelin, Nadine Bell and Sheila Ordin.
