## In Elks contest

# Franklin runners rack relay win

First-place finishes in the discus and the pole vault—the final two events to be completed—enabled the Springfield team to slip past Redford Bishop Borgess and win the 12th annual Elks Relays last weekend for boys' track teams.

The Patriots compiled 47 points, only four more than Borgess. Dearborn, the defending champion, finished third with 31 points. Twelve teams participated in the festivities at Westland John Glenn.

Don Boka, Chuck Heil and Kevin Eddy tallied a length of 48 feet four inches in the discus to establish a new meet record, while Dave Kmet, Pat McDonald and Bruce DeNapoli soared a combined height of 37 feet in the pole vault.

Both Kmet and DeNapoli cleared 13 feet.

Franklin's other field-besting performance came in the long jump, where Tim O'Grady, Bob McFarlane and Dave Bowen combined for a distance of 58 feet six inches.

Second-place efforts in the mile, 800- and 400-yard relays also played a big part in the Patriots' triumph.

"I knew we'd make a good showing, but I didn't know how good," said Franklin coach Bob Holmes.

"Obviously, we had a real nice day to perform and everyone did."

"Thirteen years we've been going to the Elks Relays and we finally won," Holmes continued. "We've had pretty good teams before and not won."

Borgess won four events en route to its second-place team standing.

Tim O'Hare, Paul Suchowski, Bill Rogers and Matt Krogulecki teamed to win both the low, 1-42.3, and the high, 1-05.1, shuttle hurdle relays and set new meet records in both races.

Tim Turner, Matt Harmon, Steve Krogulecki and Matt Krogulecki prevailed in the 400-yard relay, 4:12.3 seconds, and Kevin Nelan, Steve Krogulecki, Harmon and Turner won the 800-yard relay, 1:32.5.

Livonia Stevenson, which placed fourth with 28 points, won the two mile relay in 9:21.5 with the foursome of Jaime Galindo, Rich Dubois, Lyle Keltman and Scott Hauser.

Glenn landed sixth with 24 points and claimed victory in the high jump. Brad Jennings, Paul Langlois and Randy Gabrys tallied 18 feet in that event.

Stevenson's David Hall had the best high jump of the day, six feet two inches.

Courtesy Vance won the 120-yard high hurdles with a 1:15 time.

"He was a hard ahead of everybody at the finish," Country Day coach George Browne said.

Country Day also third in the low hurdles (4:15) and second in the long jump (20.8). In addition he participated on the 400-yard relay team which placed fourth with a 4:7.6 effort.

Kurt Wolfe, Allan Cutler and Paul Conway were also on that relay.

Country Day's 800-yard relay team of Dave Koppin, Mark Fennell, Paul Conway and Ed Guidi took first place with a 1:33.0 time.

Guidi also placed fourth in the discus (124-11). Fennell was third in

the long jump (20.7) and fourth in the 100-yard relay (1:04.1).

Koppin placed second in the mile run (4:37.8) and fourth in the 220-yard dash (2:38).

Country Day coach Browne commended Charlie Keller for placing in both the mile run (second 4:37.8) and the 800-yard run (fourth 2:05.2). Scott Stroud was fifth in the 800-yard run with a 2:05.3 time.

Country Day travels to Lutheran West Thursday for a Metro Conference meet.

"We were outnumbered and outmaneuvered. The kids just gave us superior effort every minute of the game," Reilly said.

That is the date on which a Michigan AAU Youth Team will meet the National Junior Russian Team at Schoolcraft College in Livonia.

Tip-off time is 8 p.m. Tickets, at \$5 per person, will be available at the door of the physical education building or may be purchased in advance at the same site.

Schoolcraft is located at 18000 Haggerty between Six and Seven Mile.

The Michigan team consists of selected high school seniors, most of whom have been named to various all-state teams.

They include Rob Gonzalez, from Detroit Catholic Central, Keith Smith, Detroit Mackenzie, Walker D. Russell, Pontiac Central, Joe Kopnick, Warren Fitzgerald, and Cedric Olden, Highland Park.
