Annual tree sale gets under way

Farmington Hills Beautification Commission is taking orders for a large variety of prime quality trees, all potted and well developed. It is the ninth annual spring sale for the group which has sold more than 2,000 trees to residents.

Sue Zurilla, tree sale chairman, said, "Not only do trees add beauty, they save energy by cooling the home, cut down on noise and clean the air. It is with these thoughts that the commission offers the trees.

Deadline for ordering is May 15. The trees are to be picked up at Steinkopf Nursery, 20815 Farmington Road, on May 20, between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m.

Persons who wish to order five or more trees can ask for delivery for a fee of \$3.

NORWAY MAPLE reaches a height of 40 feet, grows best in light sandy soil, has a dense crown and rounded head, and turns yellow in the fall.


CRIMSON KING MAPLE reaches a height of 60 feet, has dark red leaves most of the season and grows into a full, rounded tree. It requires a well drained soil.

MOUNTAIN ASH reaches 35 to 40 feet, and has white flowers in the spring and heavy fruit in the fall. It grows best in well drained soil.

PURPLE LEAF PLUS reaches 20 feet, has dark purple foliage all summer and flowers in the spring. A well drained soil is required.

FLOWERING CRABAPPLE is an extremely hardy tree that reaches 20 to 25 feet and thrives in most any soil. It gives a profusion of bloom in the spring. White, pink and red flowering varieties are offered.

RED BUD grows 15 to 20 feet and likes wet soil conditions for its bright red.

purplish-pink flowers that bloom in masses in the spring.

RUSSIAN OLIVE grows 15 to 20 feet with a silver leaf and flowers in the spring. It likes a sandy soil, is a fast grower, and is recommended for tall screening or a tall hedge.

ROSE TREE OF CHINA is a small

ornamental tree similar to flowering almond but has larger blossoms. It will reach a height of seven to ten feet and blooms with bright double pink flowers in May, before the leaves come out. It grows in most any soil.

SUNBURST LOCUST reaches up to 25 feet, is graceful and a rapid grower. Its foliage is bright yellow at the tips throughout the entire growing season. Grows in most any soil.

HYBRID GREEN LOCUST is a fast growing tree with delicate foliage that reaches up to 30 feet. Grows in most any soil.
