## MSU Graduate Classes Planned For Southfield

Duane M. Tesler, regional director of Michigan State University's Graduate Center for Continuing Education, has announced the launching of a new extension program leading to a Master's degree in English. Slated to begin Oct. 7 in Southfield High School, a seminar in the Teaching of English will offer three graduate term credits in MSU's Department of English. Up to this time courses offered by MSU's 35 extension centers have led primarily to graduate degrees in education. The new program in English has been developed to offer secondary English teachers extensive graduate work in their "subject area."

The seminar in English will be conducted by Robert Donaldson, an experienced teacher and active member of the statewide Committee to Improve the Teaching of English. Dr. James H. Pickering, Graduate Chairman of MSU's English Department, will coordinate the Master's program in English.

Enrollment in the first course will be limited to 25 to assure ample opportunity for individual participation. The seminar series will focus on the primary language process -- reading, writing and speaking, thus offering practical and professional assistance in solving teaching problems.

Students may also register the first night of class, 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 7, in Southfield High School.

It is not necessary for students to be formally admitted to a graduate program to enroll in this course and graduate status can be established during the term.

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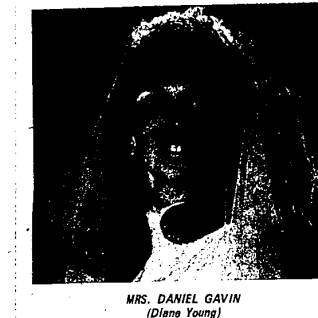
