picked up. The pickups will be on the regularly scheduled days for garbage pickup.

The program was started last May through the combined efforts of the Township Beautification Committee, Zoning Inspector Ralph Bell, Supervisor Curtis Hall and the Township Board.

After the October drive ends, there will not be another pickup of large items until May.
