



DAVID EHRLICH

Concert stars two winners

Two well-known musicians will appear as guest artists at the annual Artist Concert of the Music Study Club of Metropolitan Detroit. The event is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in the main sanctuary of Temple Beth El in Birmingham.

David Ehrlich, violinist, won the National Federation of Music Clubs Young Artist Auditions in 1975. He was the first non-American to win the federation's award. Born in Poland, his parents emigrated to Israel when David was 1 year old. The American Israel Cultural Fund sponsored his musical education.

Ehrlich graduated from Tel-Aviv University with high honors. He served as concertmaster of both Ramat-Gan Israel Chamber Orchestra and the Holon Chamber Orchestra.

He completed his BA requirements at Northern Illinois University in DeKalb, where he studied with Shmuel Askenasi. When the university initiated a solo competition, Ehrlich succeeded in winning the event on twice and appeared both times as soloist with the orchestra.

Currently he is a faculty member at the university and has just been appointed concertmaster of the Chicago Philharmonic Orchestra. He made his New York debut in the fall of 1975. The New York Times critic, Raymond Ericson, wrote: "Mr. Ehrlich is a very talented violinist who has the virtues to be expected from a prize winner."

Randie Lee Blooding, winner of the 1977 Young Artists Auditions of the National Federation of Music Clubs, is a native of Colorado. He received his bachelor of music education degree at Colorado State University and earned his master of music degree in voice from Southern Methodist University in 1975.

Recently he completed his doctor of music arts degree at Ohio State University, and he has accepted a position

on the faculty at Middle Tennessee State University.

Blooding has performed leading baritone roles in many operas, including "Tosca," "La Traviata," "Fidelio" and "Don Giovanni." He has also appeared as soloist with the Dallas Civic Symphony Orchestra, Ohio State University Choir, Columbus Symphony Orchestra and the Southern Methodist University Choir.

A Colorado critic wrote: "Mr. Blooding's acting and fine singing were the hit of the evening." The Denver Post reported that "... the rich voice of the young baritone soared over the orchestra."

AAUW will hostess tea for LIT women

Thirty-six women graduates at Lawrence Institute of Technology will be honored at a tea from 3:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 10, at the campus home of Mrs. Wayne H. Buell, wife of LIT's chief executive officer and chairman of the board.

This is the largest number of women graduates in the 46-year history of the institution.

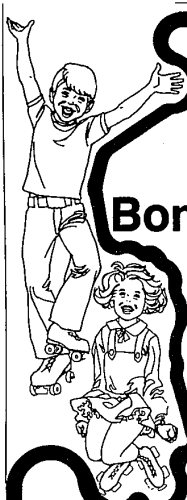
The American Association of University Women will sponsor the event, under the leadership of Barbara Gram, associate professor of humanities in LIT's school of arts and science, and the college's 21 women faculty members.

Assisting at the tea table will be Mrs. Richard Marburger, wife of the college's president. Special guests

include Mrs. Walter Frantczak of Farmington Hills, president of the Farmington Chapter of AAUW.

Bachelor of science degrees will be conferred on women in the following schools: Arts and Sciences—two in chemistry, three in humanities and three in mathematics; Engineering—one in electrical and two in mechanical; Architecture—eight bachelor of science degrees in architecture, plus two fifth-year bachelor of architect degrees.

Also Business and Industrial Management—14 in business administration and one in industrial management. A total of 547 students have petitioned to receive diplomas June 4, which also is expected to make this the largest graduating class to date.
