

Marathon attracts Andover runner

It started out as a trip East to visit colleges. While she was there, Ann Schoene, a 17-year-old Andover High School junior, ran the first marathon of her life—the Boston Marathon.

Of the estimated 6,000 people who ran in the 1978 edition of the Boston Marathon, 4,000 had run the qualifying time and registered for the race.

Another 2,000 runners went along for the ride.

Bob Self, an administrative aid at Andover High School, was one of the unregistered runners.

Self has been running the past two

years. Boston was his second marathon.

"I'm addicted to running," Self said. "I met a lot of real nice people and pretty soon I was real involved in running."

Self said it would be very difficult for someone his weight (186 pounds) to reach the qualifying time for the Boston Marathon.

He found out that Schoene would be in the East when the Boston Marathon was scheduled.

"ABOUT A WEEK before the race," Schoene said, "Self told me he was running. He wanted me to run half of the marathon with him as an unregistered runner."

Schoene is a three-sport star at Andover High School. She ran cross country in the fall. During the winter she competes with the gymnastics team. Two years ago, she was the Observer & Eccentric's first team all-around gymnast. In spring Schoene runs with the girls' track team.

She is interested in a nursing career. Schoene was planning to visit Boston College with her parents.

"I've never trained for a marathon," Schoene said, "but I said 'OK, I'll run halfway.'"

But a funny thing happened along the route. It's part of the magic which makes the Boston Marathon the grandaddy of all marathons.

"My parents were waiting at the halfway point," Schoene said, "waiting for me to stop. There were people all over the place. When I stopped they started yelling, 'You can make it! You can make it!'"

"I didn't want to let them down," Schoene said, "so I told my parents I was going to finish the race."

Schoene has gotten the marathon bug. When she doesn't have track on weekends, Schoene said she runs five or six miles. She plans to run in the Belle Isle Marathon, with an eye toward qualifying for the Boston Marathon.

Racquetball tourney set

The Kensington Academy is an independent school for boys. It was founded in 1968 by a group of Catholic parents who wanted a school, grades 1-8, which could provide intellectual stimulation and guidance to each boy.
