"THE \$15 SEATS have all been sold out for Brenner, so the box office is telling people to call us," Harrison said. The dinner and theater combination for Brenner (the dinner is always \$10) will be \$25 per person.

According to Harrison, the Midlown was contacted by the Birmingham Theatre to make the package arrangement. Twenty-five special seats have been reserved for the package. "This will continue throughout the play season," Harrison said. "We're excited. It's something that's happening in the community."

He said the Middown is paying straight price for the theater tickets, "It's hard to put together a \$10 meal with drinks."
