

Cabaret Pops series details spring program

Concerts

The Detroit Symphony Orchestra has announced additional program details of the Spring 1978 Cabaret Pops series at the Detroit Light Guard Armory on May 19-20, 24-25 and 26-27. All performances are at 8:30 p.m.

The first pair of performances, May 19 and 20, will feature jazz great, pianist George Shearing, and DSO Principal Pops Conductor Richard Hayman. The program will blend the full sound of the orchestra with Shearing in Bach's Concerto in D minor and the

The second program, May 24 and 25, is an all-new DSO program of some of the best of the Rodgers and Hammerstein Broadway classics. Richard Hayman again will conduct the orchestra, joined by soprano Bonnie Murray, mezzo-soprano Anita Darian, tenor Gene Bullard, baritone Robert Trehy and the Rackham Symphony Choir.

NOSTALGIA WILL be in the air as the DSO opens the program with an orchestra overture including "Okla-

homa!," "The Sound of Music," "With a Song in My Heart," "There Is Nothing Like a Dame," "Some Enchanted Evening" and "June Is Bustin' Out All Over."

The orchestra will then be joined by the four vocalists and chorus for a presentation of Richard Rodgers' music and the lyrics of Oscar Hammerstein II and Lorenz Hart. Among the selections will be songs from "State Fair," "Mississippi," "Love Me Tonight," "Too Many Girls," "I Married An

Angel," "Carousel," "Connecticut Yankee," "South Pacific" and "Oklahoma!"

The third program of fun and nostalgia, May 26 and 27, will combine Richard Hayman and the orchestra with the Four Freshmen to produce some of the most popular favorites of the 1950s. Among the selections will be the following memorable old hits: "Polka Dots and Moonbeams," "The Day Isn't Long Enough," "It's a Blue World," "Poinciana," "Fools Rush

In" and "It Could Happen To You."

Tickets may be purchased at the Ford Auditorium Box Office, all Hudson's and Ward's ticket outlets, and the Detroit Tonight desk at the Plaza Hotel in the Renaissance Center. Show eyes go-go bar

The contemporary drama "In the Boom Boom Room" will be presented by the Student Enterprise Theatre at Oakland University for a nine-night run starting June 2.
