Murphy denies any plan in mind to bail out Pontiac Silverdome

Additional County is not rushing to aid
the City of Pontiac as it copes with a
rising tide of red ink.
Pontiac's budgetary dam burst last
month when it was discovered that the
Silverdome – the home of the Detroit
Lions, Pistons and Express – had a
3.7 million deficit. The deficit is
attributable to a \$4.2 million payment
as this year's installment retring a
\$15.9 million municipal bond issue.
The Silverdome is financed through
Pontiac's general fund.
Stories that Oakland County would
lend a helping hand surfaced over the
weekend. County Executive Daniel T.
Murphy, however, denied that the
county has any such plans.

THE RUMORS started, he said, after he had answered a hypothetical question at a meeting of the 100 Club, a Pontiac civic organization, last weekend

weekend.

Asked if the county would now become involved in the operation of the 80,000-set stadium, Murphy said the county board of commissioners would consider any properly-made request from the City of Pontiac. That request would have to be made by the Pontiac City Council.

"My statments have been turned into a number of things, none of them accurate." Murphy said. "As of yet, we haven't received any official communication from the City of Pontiac." The county executive also downplayed the possibility of county involvement in the Silverdome. "We'd give it a legitimate hearing, but I don't know it it's feasible. WU're not even sure it's legally possible." he said.

"It would take a lot of study. It

PONTIAC CITY MANAGER Phillip Q. Mastin could not be reached for comment, but a lengthy statement released May 12 reveals no indications for any joint Pontiac-Oakland venture or a takeover of the facility by the county.

"The city and the Pontiac Stadium Authority knew that the Silverdome was not going to break even for a number of years. Deficits were forecasted, expected and planned for," Mastin said.

"The magnitude of the deficits were a surprise," he added. "And the inability of the city's financial system to identify them in a timely manner was a major disappointment."
