

Author lectures to aid the bereaved parent

Harriet Sarnoff Schiff, author of "The Bereaved Parent," will talk about her experiences after losing a 10-year-old son, in Mercy Center June 7.

The lecture begins at 7:30 p.m. and is open to all bereaved parents and those interested in being supportive of them.

Her book tells how she fought her way back from a period of almost unbearable grief to a point where she could reconstruct her life and even take pleasure from certain accomplishments.

She says, "It is a tragedy that must not be compounded by allowing everything around you to die also."

Learning how to function became her goal, and ultimately, her achievement, which she shares with others through her book, and now her lectures.

She offers specific suggestions concerning men, who she believes suffers from stoicism and marital difficulties that result after the death of a child.

She talks about dealing with the surviving children, and the inability to appreciate anything in life, while one is suffering bereavement as a common phenomenon. She talks about funeral services and the interaction between the mourners, their friends and neighbors.
