DEFENSE BUDGET—Rejected, 115 for and 287 against, an attempt to replace a defense bill approved by the Armed Services Committee with a less-expensive substitute that was almost identical to the defense procurement bill sent to Capitol Hill by the Pentagon and the White House. Following this vote, the House passed and sent to the Senate the committee-approved version. The bill (HR 10929)

authorizes the Pentagon to spend \$7.9 billion on weapons and research in fiscal 1979, which can be a substitute was said 1979, which can be substitute was \$3.5 billion, roughly the amount recommended by the House a few weeks ago when it approved the fiscal 1979 "target" budget.


