Ed Gray Gallery—Show by gallery artists will continue through June. Included are pottery, glass, watercolors, lithos, raku and tapestries. Hours are 10 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Tuesday-Saturday, 280 N. Woodward.

Arnold Klein Gallery—A show of color etchings, aquatints and mezzotints will run through June 30. This will be the gallery's last formal show until September. The expanded gallery now has room to display watercolors, photography, paintings, graphics, sculpture, ceramics, enamels and glass. There are many respected names in the group show. Sheldon Ross Gallery—Sculptural reliefs by Sergio DeGiusti both artist and teacher, DeGiusti's works in this show are concerned with the "Story of Man." Gallery at 239 Martin.

Donald Morris Gallery—Silverpoint drawings by Detroit's Theo Wujcik will be on display through June 10. Wujcik, who studied at Society of Arts and Crafts, is now associate professor of art at the University of South Florida and director of the graphics studio there. His work is in many major museums including the Museum of Modern Art and the Whitney Museum of American Art. Silverpoint is considered to be the most difficult of the print mediums. Detroit Institute of Arts—Birmingham Society of Women Painters are showing their work in the institute's rental and sales gallery through June 4. Mary Jane Jacob, acting curator of modern art selected the art for this display.
