FRANK SURIANO

Frank James Suriano, 62, of Farmington Hills died May 24 in Metropolitan Hospital West. A high mass was said May 26 in St. Alexander Church, with the Rev. James Wright officiating. Arrangements were made by the Heene-Sundquist Funeral Home, and burial was in St. Hedwig Cemetery.

Mr. Suriano was employed with Fisher Body in Livonia for more than 25 years. Born in Pennsylvania, he was one of 13 children, and came to Michigan early in his life. He was a member of the Moose Lodge No. 1620 of Dearborn and one of the lodge's premier bowlers.

Surviving are his wife, Marion; daughter, Mrs. Ellen Patterson; seven brothers and four sisters.

Walter O. Stewart, 61, of 23370 Chapelview, Farmington Hills, died May 15 in Beaumont Hospital after a lengthy illness. Services were May 18 in the Fred Wood Funeral Home with the Rev. Leland Penzien officiating. Burial was in Cadillac Memorial Gardens.

Mr. Stewart was a carpenter. Surviving are his wife, Hazel; daughter, Wanda; sisters, Mrs. Janet Johnston, Mrs. Charlotte Barget and Mrs. Alice Boyd; and brothers, Amos, Forrest and Allen Stewart.

THOMAS McDONNELL

Thomas McDonnell, 75, of Farmington Hills died in St. Mary Hospital in Livonia. A rosary was recited in the Heene-Sundquist Funeral Home, and a high mass was said June 1 in St. Alexander Church of Farmington. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Known as Tommy McDonald when he emigrated from Scotland at the age of 9, McDonnell started his boxing career at the age of 19 in amateur boxing. At 17, he turned professional and fought 156 fights, becoming the Bantam Weight Boxing Champion of Canada.

He fought with flyweight champion Freddy Bellmur in 1918 and did exhibition fights, with Jack Dempsey in Detroit and Canada. One of his last fights was with Carl Muzzarelli, a contender for the Bantam Championship, a bout McDonnell won. He retired from the boxing world in 1928.

He was employed with Ford Motor Co. in the Rouge plant from 1925 and was a veteran of the Battle of the Overpass. He later worked as a truck driver for Ford until his retirement. Surviving are his wife, Thelma; son Thomas R. McDonnell; daughter Mrs. Laurine Stambersky; and five grandchildren.

EDITH MEYERS

Edith B. Meyers, 87, of Farmington, died May 29 in the Oakhill Nursing Home. Services were June 1 in Thayer-Rock Funeral Home with the Rev. Dean Parker officiating. Burial was in Glen Eden Memorial Cemetery.

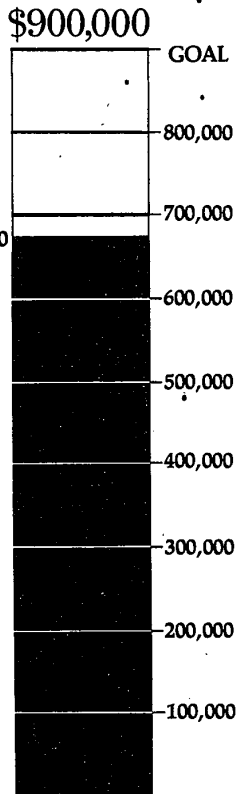

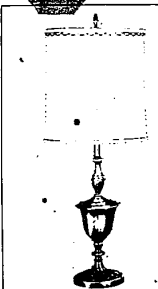
