

Rosenberg exhibit runs through June

one artist a month with an exhibit in a cooperative venture between the library and the Farmington Artists Club.

Her work is not unknown to persons who have been guests at past shows sponsored by the local club. Many of her paintings have been selected for the juried galleries.

Her show at the library this month is a collection of realistic oil paintings; some colorful impressionistic watercolors; and a variety of works done in mixed media.

Some of the mixed media include delicate collages, resists, and other fairly new mixed media techniques. One collage is combined for mono-printing, a technique that produces only an original print.

She says that the challenge of collage, and the opportunities of free expression that it lends itself to, make this one of her favorite media.

MRS. ROSENBERG is a mother and housewife who has long cherished a desire to apply a latent artistic bent.

For the rapid development of that dream, she credits much to the inspiration and encouragement of Edee Joppich, Farmington's 1978 artist-in-residence.

Ms. Joppich is a past president of Farmington Artists Club, and took the artist-in-residence tribute from the Farmington Area Arts Commission this month.

Mrs. Rosenberg began painting as one of Ms. Joppich's students, and studied in several workshops at Oakland Community College.

The Rosenbergs, who were residents of Farmington Hills for several years, now live in Green Oak Township.

Youth, ages 3-11, invited to day camp.

The Farmington Area YMCA starts its summer series of day camp programs for youth from 3 to 11 years old, on June 19.

Three-day camps are offered: Pre-School Camp, Kiddie Camp and Day Camp.

Pre-School Camp is for the 3- and 4-year-olds who meet either at the Farmington Y, the Novi Methodist Church, or the Church of Holy Cross in

Novi for group play, art, walks, stories and games.

Sessions run from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., or 1-4 p.m.

Costs for all camps are slightly higher for those who aren't members of the Y.

Kiddie Camp is conducted in Farmington City Park and in Novi for the 5- and 6-year-olds geared to give the camper an away-from-home experience. The emphasis is on helping the children build healthy attitudes toward cooperative work, play and group adjustment. Each session will run for three hours a day for five days.

Day Camp, for 6-11-year-olds, is located on a 300-acre site near Milford. The Y provides daily bus transportation picking the campers up at 8:30 a.m. and returning them at 4 p.m.

The interim hours offer horseback riding, archery, nature study, crafts, boating, art, and swim lessons.

"Day camping is rapidly becoming one of the Y's most popular programs across the U.S.," said Gary Unruh, executive director of the Farmington Y. About 400,000 youngsters participated in Y camps last year.

"Many parents like the idea of their children spending summer days outdoors under qualified supervision, yet still being home at evenings and weekends for family activities," Unruh said.
