Color and pattern, like cakes and ale, beer and stittles, must go hand in glove for true success in descrution. Therefore an understanding of each important before you tackle a project. The second step in the color process is a color scheme. Here we are talking about a family of three or four basic

hues, with one or two invited guests as accents. It is quite possible to use many colors in a scheme or monchromatics, but these solutions are not easy to bring off and are best left to the professional designer.

For the basic family of colors, those which are thought of as compatible, make the best selection. For example: bulg, green and white; or ange, beige and red; or green, yellow and gray.

Usually it is best to use the most neutral of the group, perhaps in a lighter shade, for the largest expanses—walls and ceiling and carpets.

ACENTS, LIKE GOOD GUESTS, should be chosen for their sparkle, for the contrast they provide to the basic family. Scatter them about the room in accessories, pictures, lamp shades, throw rugs, ashtrays, and even books and flowers.
