

Oregon senator will be keynoter

US Sen. Robert W. Packwood, Republican of Oregon, and a supporter of Israel, will be the guest speaker at the Jewish National Fund Testimonial

Dinner in Southfield on June 21. The testimonial will honor Charles and Florence Milun and will open with a cocktail hour at 6:30 p.m. at Congre-

gation Shaarey Zedek. The couple have been active in the community and in causes on behalf of Israel.

Sen. Packwood was one of the senate leaders who opposed the sale of war planes to Egypt and Saudi Arabia and has denounced the State Department for a "long standing and blatant" anti-Jewish bias.

He likened the sale of US war planes to Saudi Arabia and Egypt to the appeasement of Hitler at Munich. "I would have also thought that Munich would have taught us the lesson, 'Never again,' he said.

Sen. Packwood is a great-grandson of William H. Packwood, Oregon pioneer and member of the Oregon constitutional convention of 1857.

A graduate of the New York University School of Law, he began his political career in 1962. He was elected to the US Senate in 1968 as the youngest senator in the 91st Congress. He was reelected in 1974.

Sen. Packwood is a member of three committees: Finance, Commerce, Sci-

ence and Transportation and belongs to Select Small Business Committees as well.

He has been cited by Bnai Brith and its Anti-Defamation League. In 1973 the University of Judaism and the Portland Society of Fellows honored him with the an award for public service.
